

Parking in St Mary's Churchyard

St Mary's PCC agreed at their recent meeting that, from 1 July, the **only** people permitted to park in the churchyard are:

- Blue badge holders who have limited mobility and cannot walk from car parks in the town
- Paid church staff
- Anyone taking a service

On a recent Friday morning, there were 15 cars parked in the churchyard, meaning that every available space (and some inappropriate space) was used. If a disabled visitor had wanted to come to Café Church, this would have prevented them from doing so. We are not short of free public parking in the town, all within a few minutes' walk of the church. If you need to drop off or unload, you are of course more than welcome to do this and then park elsewhere. The former permits system is no longer in operation, as far too many people have them and it has become unworkable. Restricting the numbers of cars parking in the churchyard will also enable to grass to grow on those patches where it has been destroyed, thus improving the look of our surroundings. Thank you for your co-operation.
